#### 1. A Profile of the College:

In the early part of the eighth decade of the last 20th century the people of Tingkhong strongly felt the necessity of a higher educational institution within the vast area of Tingkhong Legislative Assembly Coustituency. It was therefore resolved unanimously to start a College at Tingkhong in a meeting held in May 1972. Accordingly, Tingkhong College was established with Arts stream on the 1st of September, 1972 to cater higher education to the needy poor and girl students of the surrounding rural and tea garden areas

## (a) Location and Campus:

The college is located in a large campus of 45 bighas of land by the side of the Tingkhong-Numrup Road at a distance of 0.75 km. fromTingkhong Oil Depot Tiniali i.e from Moran Naharkatia PWD Road - with a picturesque surrounding conducive for pursuit of learning.

## (b) Objective of the College:

The avowed objective of Tingkhong College is (i) to provide higher education to the poor, rural and tea garden students, specially the girl students and (ii) to spread the light of higher education to the region (iii) thereby to make the region enable to pace with the progress of time.

#### (c) The College Emblem:

Any student passed in H.S.L.C. or equivalent examination is eligible for admission in the H.S. Course.


Higher Secondary students have to appear class tests in every week. It is compulsory for each & every student.



11. Identity Card:

An Identity card will be issued to each student after admission. A student must carry the card while coming to the college.

#### 12. Attendance in classes:

Regular attendance in all classes is compulsory.

i. A student must attend not less than 80% of the classes held in the subjects including the tutorials to be eligible for appearing as a regular student in the Higher Secondary examinations and Semester Examinations.

ii. No student shall, however, be allowed to appear in any above mentioned examination whose attendance falls below 80% of the classes held.

iii. A student must attend in all seminars and symposia and talks organized by the college.

## 13. Attendance in college examinations:

- (A) A student must attend in all Sessional and Test Examinations conducted by the college.
- (B) A CBCS student must attend Sessional Examinations conducted by the Departments. Internal assessment in each course shall be based on attendance, assessment of 1st & 2nd Sessional examinations and seminar/group discussion. There shall be no provision for "repeat" in the Sessional Examination.

## 14. Rules and Regulations:

- i. Students must maintain discipline and punctuality in attending college and classes.
  - ii. Students must come to college in full uniform.
- iii. Students shall conduct themselves in a courteous manner towards both staff (teaching & non-teaching) and fellow students.

iv. Students shall maintain silence in classroom and desist from disorderly behaviour.

v. Students shall take care of college property and must not cause any damage to them.

vi. Students shall keep their bicycle, scooter etc. in the shed provided for the purpose.

vii. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited and any student found indulging in such activities shall be strongly dealt with as per rules.

viii. Students shall have to take prior permission from the principal (i) to organize any meeting (ii) to invite any guest to address students and (iii) to display any kind of notice in the notice board of the college.

ix. Students shall actively participate in all the functions organized by the college and students' union.

x. Students shall keep the campus and the classroom of the college clean and maintain a congenial atmosphere for pursuit of learning.



- (iv) Class Attendance: 25% of marks allotted for I.A.





#### 25. Research Journal:



Likewise the other departments also publish Journal and Wall Magazine and organise seminar, workshop, talks etc.




